MEMBERSHIP Levels and Fees

Senior: \$60, (or \$50 if paid by March 31st) Any person 18 years or over as of January 1, 2015
Junior: \$50, (or \$40 if paid by March 31st) Any person under 18 years as of January 1, 2015
Family: \$120, (or \$100 if paid by March 31st) Immediate formity, members including up to 2 Senior

Immediate family members including up to 2 Senior members & all children under 18 years as of January 1, 2015

Temporary: \$20 (can be used once per year)

Non-competitive: \$30 (can only be purchased through mail-in form found on the AHTA website)

The temporary membership can only be purchased once per year. A temporary membership has no voting privileges and is not eligible for AHTA awards. After the use of a temporary membership a full membership must be purchased. The cost of the temporary membership will be applied to the purchase of a full membership.

AEF memberships are required to compete in Alberta, as the insurance component is NOT covered by the Equine Canada Sport License. AHTA full memberships are now available online when purchasing your AEF membership.

The Omnibus is supplied by Equine Canada, and EC Rulebooks are available on the Equine Canada website.

A non-competitive membership is intended to support the association and sport of eventing in Alberta. It has no voting privileges and can only be purchased through the mail-in form found on the AHTA website.

You will need to purchase an Equine Canada Sport License in order to compete. The level of the license will depend on the level of the division you wish to compete in.

Starter to Pretraining – Bronze License Training – Silver License Prelim – Gold License

No Fee Pony Club/4-H Promotions

All Pony Club or 4-H members are entitled to participate in 1 event or clinic without requiring an AHTA Membership. Any additional competitions / clinics require either a \$20 Temporary Membership or a full AHTA Membership. EC Memberships are a separate requirement. For the NO Fee Pony Club/4-H Promotions, all show results will be counted for Year End Awards with the subsequent purchase of a full AHTA membership.

AHTA GENERAL INFORMATION

DIVISIONS RULES

For official levels - Advanced, Intermediate, Preliminary, Training, Pre-Training and Entry: see the Equine Canada and/or FEI Rule Book.

The levels below Entry will be designated by the names Pre-Entry and Starter. The intention of these levels is to provide an introduction to the sport for new eventers and young horses. These levels are subject to all rules pertaining to Entry with the following specifications:

<u>Starter</u> Maximum Height: 60 cm Maximum Speed Cross Country: 300 mpm Maximum Speed Stadium: 300 mpm Speed windows apply as per Entry rules. Single jumping efforts only – no related distances. No oxers. Verticals or cross rails only. No drops. No mandatory water. No obstacles without height. Courses are to be simple and inviting with considerate placement of cross country

fences (ie. **NOT next to preliminary level fence**). Fences are to be wide and inviting with no fill. A maximum of 30% of the jumps are allowed to be at maximum height.

Pre-Entry

Maximum Height: 75 cm Maximum Speed Cross Country: 325 mpm Maximum Speed Stadium: 300 mpm Speed windows apply as per Entry rules. Single jumping efforts only. No drops. No mandatory water. Obstacles without height must have an option. Courses are to be simple and inviting. A maximum of 30% of the jumps are allowed to be at maximum.

ALBERTA PROVINCIAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1. The Championships will include all divisions.
- 2. All horse/rider combinations meeting the criteria listed below will be eligible to enter the championships.
- 3. Eligible horse/rider combinations will be automatically entered in the Championships by the event secretary, upon receipt of their entries to the Alhambra Fall Event. There is no additional cost for the Championship entry.
- 4. Championship ribbons will be presented at the competition, and prize money will be awarded for Champion and Reserve Champion at the Annual Awards Banquet.
- 5. Additional bonus points will be awarded to the riders competing at the Alberta Provincial Championships. The intent is to encourage participation of qualified riders in the Championships, and to recognize the achievements of the competitors.

QUALIFYING CRITERIA FOR ALBERTA CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1. Completed 2 <u>Alberta</u> competitions in the current year at the level you plan to compete at in the Championships.
- 2. AHTA member in good standing.
- 3. Have NOT completed more than 2 competitions (same horse and rider combination) in the current year at a higher level than what you intend to enter.
- 4. Achieved a "Top 8 Finish" at a current year Alberta event for the level entered.

The AHTA is very proud to announce that it is beginning the ninth year of the High Performance Eventing Program. This program is funded jointly through a generous grant from Alberta Sport Council and the AHTA; in association with the Alberta Equestrian Federation.

The purpose of the program is to help support and develop the upper level Alberta coaches, riders and horses through regular clinics with top clinicians. The High Performance Coach/Consultant is Lynda Ramsay from Kelowna, BC. This year, our clinicians include Lynda Ramsay, Leslie Law, April Clay, James Alliston and Claudia Cojocar.

To become an active member of the High Performance Program, the riders need to meet certain competition criteria at the Preliminary Level and above. Please refer to the AHTA website, to view the guidelines. All coaches are encouraged to attend our clinics and there is no charge for auditing.

Riders who wish to be considered for the 2016 HP program must complete the Registration Form located on the web site and submit their qualifications to the HP Committee by November 30, 2015.

AHTA YEAR END AWARDS AND SUBSIDIES

All awards to be awarded at the discretion of the AHTA Board. Awards may only be won by AHTA members and will include all divisions. Results from Alberta events are tracked and reported by the Event Organizers and the Statistician.

Out-of-Province and/or Country results for divisions offered within Alberta will be excluded from the leader board. Out-of-Province and/or Country results will still be accepted for divisions not offered in Alberta in order to continue to recognize AHTA members competing at higher levels including CIC*/CCI*, Intermediate & CIC**/CCI**, Advanced & CIC**/CCI***. This change will not affect travel subsidies awarded to those competing out of province for Preliminary and up. Out-of-Province and/or Country results must still be submitted prior to October 1, of each year to qualify for travel subsidies.

The following is a list of awards/subsidies AHTA members may be eligible for. All awards/subsidies are granted at the full discretion of the board and may not be awarded on an annual basis:

- Dressage Bonus and Show Jumping Bonus (To encourage members to improve their dressage and show jumping performance and to reward those who have shown themselves capable of competing in a recognized show).
- Upgrading Award (This award is to encourage AHTA members to upgrade to the Preliminary level of eventing)
- **Competition Subsidies** (Subsidies may vary from year to year based on funding availability and will be determined in January/February of the year following competition results. All or part of the expenses to be paid, are at the discretion of the Board.)

- **High Point Awards (**The high point award will be given annually at the Awards Banquet to the horse/rider combination of each division who has accumulated the highest number of points in the current season.)
- **Top Rider Award** (To recognize and provide assistance to Alberta's elite riders competing at the Intermediate and Advanced level of Eventing: to the rider obtaining the highest number of points at recognized Events and Horse Trials at the Intermediate and/or Advanced levels.)
- Coach of the Year Award (To recognize excellence in coaching)

PLEASE REFER TO THE AHTA WEBSITE FOR FURTHER INFORMATION REGARDING THE AWARDS/SUBSIDIES AVAILABLE TO AHTA MEMBERS AND THE REQUIRED CRITERIA/CONDITIONS FOR EACH.

RIDER REPRESENTATIVE

Attends or appoints an alternate to attend all events. The purpose is to provide a vehicle for riders to communicate with event organizers or to find out where to go for various types of assistance. The name of the Rider Representative (or alternate) must be posted on the scoreboard, along with instructions for contact. Riders wishing to make a point with regard to a jump, or the course itself, or any facet of the competition, should do so through the Rider Representative. The Rider Representative, however, does not handle protests. Competitors wishing to put in a protest must do so as indicated in EC Rules. EC Rules will always supersede any authority of the Competitions Committee or rider Representative. Any complaints regarding an event should be given to the Rider Representative to bring to the attention of the Competitions Committee and the AHTA, who can then open discussions with those concerned. The Rider Representative should also be able to direct riders to the appropriate people or officials to obtain assistance where needed. In order to protect against liability situations, the Rider Representative must be careful not to dispense advice with regard to coaching techniques or the giving of instruction, but rather is to direct competitors to the right source in order to find the help they may need.

Tips for First-Time Competitors

Or anyone who might like to try!

If you are thinking of trying eventing out for the first time, you might want to try the Starter or Pre-entry division. These dressage tests requires only walk, trot and canter in a series of relatively simple patterns. The cross country can be ridden at a slow steady canter, giving you plenty of time to drop down to the trot for fence approaches if you want. The stadium jumping will also be straight forward and encouraging with no combinations. Take a look at table 1.1 to get an idea about the dimensions and speeds involved in the different divisions.

Tips

- Enter early! Classes fill quickly.
- Remember you need the appropriate memberships.
- Know the rules. A rule book can be purchased either from EC or the AEF offices.
- Be in condition; this is not just a test for the horse! Plus, time spent conditioning your horse is time well spent in developing trust and confidence between the two of you.
- Walk the cross country course several times.
- Ask questions. Eventers are very friendly and help each other.
- Never go faster than you need to!
- Don't forget the mandatory tack checks before each phase.
- Always keep the RED flag on your RIGHT hand side (in practice rings AND on course).
- In the dressage test, wait for the judge's signal before entering the ring.
- In dressage, use a white or black saddle pad if possible. It is customary to braid your horse's mane, but not the tail.
- After the signal in dressage, you can ride around the outside of the ring before entering, but you must start the test within one minute of the signal.
- Don't forget to salute the judge at end of your dressage test. Learn the correct salute (you can ask a fellow eventer or the ring steward about this).
- In the stadium jumping test, salute the judge and once you hear the signal you have 45 seconds to cross the start line.
- Say thank you to the organizer or write a thank you note afterwards.
- Bring a friend to help out, and share the day's fun with you.
- Most importantly; HAVE FUN!

Some important rules (but make sure you consult your Rule Book):


- You will have to wear an approved armband, containing a card on which you have listed a collection of personal medical information, while riding over obstacles (cross country and stadium jumping). Armbands are available for purchase (\$15). The kind of information you will need, in order to fill out the card, includes:
 - Your name, birthdate, and Alberta Health Care number
 - Name, relationship and phone number of next of kin.
 - Your rig and horse trailer description and license plate number.
 - Your doctor's name and contact information.
 - Your medical history.
- 2. You may have heard about various penalties for refusals, run-outs, etc. on the cross country test. The idea of an error committed by horse while attempting to negotiate an obstacle is very important. The details of all this are in the Rule Book, but in general, here is some information.
 - A refusal: Occurs whenever a horse being presented to an obstacle stops. If the horse steps backwards (even a little bit), that counts as a refusal as well. Once a refusal has been recorded, if the horse is presented again, and


commits another "stop", that is counted as a second refusal. A refusal is considered a disobedience in scoring.


- A run-out: Occurs if the horse, having been presented to the obstacle, avoids the element in such a way that it must be presented again. The rider can choose any tactic and/or angle permitted by the dimensions of the obstacle, but once the commitment is made and the horse has been presented, a run-out with be recorded if the horse avoids the obstacle. A run-out is considered a disobedience in scoring.
- 3. One more reminder: On cross country, you are not required to re-jump all the elements in a combination obstacle if you have a refusal or run-out at any one of them. You may if you wish, but you can also just re-present to the element at which you had the refusal (or run-out). This whole situation can get quite complicated fairly quickly, so the best advice is read the Rule Book, and consult your coach for advice and help.
- 4. Your Rule Book contains all kinds of important (and useful) information, and should be read carefully and used constantly. For instance, it will tell you that certain pieces of equipment are permitted in one phase but not in another (and, of course, that certain other pieces are never permitted). Here's a sample of those restrictions:








Scoring

In the sport of eventing the object is to get the lowest score possible, since everything is calculated as "penalty points."

Your dressage score, therefore, is calculated as however much "less than perfect" (there is a formula used to convert the traditional dressage marks, as awarded by the judge, into this penalty version). From there onwards, your goal is to incur no additional points at all. A fault-free cross country ride, and stadium jumping round, would achieve that goal, by producing zero penalty points each.

However, if you have any "refusals" or (in the stadium) knockdowns, or if you exceed the optimum time allowed for either ride, you will be awarded penalties:

Cross Country:

1 st disobedience at an obstacle	20 penalties
2 nd disobedience at an obstacle	40 penalties
3 rd disobedience at an obstacle	Elimination
4 disobediences total on course	Elimination
1 st fall of rider on course	Elimination
1 st fall of horse on course	Elimination
Over optimum time	0.4 penalties per second
Under optimum time minus	
30 seconds (window)	1 penalty per
	second

Stadium (Training level and below)

Please note that these descriptions are only a brief summary. For full details consult your Rule Book.

Tips for Event Spectators

Spectators are very welcome at all phases of Horse Trials.

Competitors enjoy performing for an audience, and being appreciated for their efforts. Feel free to ask questions at the show office, or of anyone who is not busy with a horse, or judging and scoring. Please remember that the competitors are probably quite focused on what they are doing, and that **HORSES HAVE THE RIGHT OF WAY AT ALL TIMES**. A cry of "**HEADS UP**" means clear the way, quickly!

For your own and our competitor's safety, please remain alert to the following precautions:

- If you are not familiar with horses, be aware that they are large, unpredictable animals and are easily frightened by sudden movements, sounds and unfamiliar sights.
- Horses are often spirited at shows, and can, at times, be difficult for a rider to control. Please give horses and riders ample room to maneuver.
- Avoid startling horses by running or shouting, and advise your children to keep well back.
- Dogs must remain on leash at all times. No exceptions please!
- In the stabling area caution is advised; though rare, some horses may bite or kick under the stress of competition. Respect all signs, always ask first and you will find most competitors will be pleased to introduce you to their horse.

During the **DRESSAGE** Phase, a lot of concentration is required on the part of horses, riders, and judges. Please remember to keep as quiet as possible, and stay a reasonable distance from the dressage rings. No allowance is given if a horse is frightened by something outside of the ring, and the competitor may lose marks through no fault of their own.

Eventing and Horse Trials are thrilling sports for spectators to watch, and with appropriate attentiveness, we're sure you will enjoy the competition!

CROSS-COUNTRY day can be tense for everyone. Competitors are focused intently on the job at hand, and often horses too, appear excited about the upcoming challenges. The rider will be concentrating on their best route on course, and may not be aware of a spectator crossing their path. While you are welcome to walk along and watch anywhere along the course, it is vital you are at no time on a path a horse and rider may be using. Some jumps offer optional routes, which the rider may choose at the last moment, and each division follows a different course. This means that consecutive riders may not take the same path that the previous or next rider uses. Also, there may be several minutes between riders, and very little warning time to react to a galloping horse from "nowhere".

When near cross-country obstacles, it is wise to hold on to small children, and be quiet and still to ensure the only challenge the approaching riders and their mounts face is the jumping obstacles the approaching riders and their mounts face is the jumping obstacles! The riders will still be penalized for a refusal or run-out even if caused by a spectator's unintentional distraction Remember that competitors will be eliminated if any assistance is given to them, even if they don't ask for it. Don't talk to them, point the way or 'coach' from the sidelines. Cheering them on is most acceptable and encouraged! Safety considerations do allow spectators to help in the event of a fall of a rider. If a rider is off their horse, you may help to catch the horse, or to adjust saddlery or equipment, and the rider to remount. It is also legal to hand whip, headgear, or eyeglasses back to a rider without their having to dismount. You may not mount the rider's horse and bring it back to them. Lastly, you must always consider helping with your own safety first; galloping unmounted horses are not easy to deal with!

In **STADIUM JUMPING**, spectators often line the arena fences to gain the best view of this last and often nerve wracking phase. Again, no unauthorized assistance or "coaching" from the sidelines is permitted. Usually the order of go is the reverse order of placing. The competitors require intense concentration and appreciate if noises and distractions, such as barking dogs, are kept to a minimum.

Be sure to applaud loudly for each rider at the end of each round, for now their job is done & it is hugely satisfying to be recognized for all their hard efforts!

Important checklist for spectators

- ✓ Horses have the right of way at all times.
- "Heads up" means clear the way, quickly!
- ✓ Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times.
- ✓ Keep your children well back and under your control.
- ✔ Give horses and riders ample room to maneuver.
- Be aware that routes and obstacles may differ for each rider! Don't wander onto a path a horse/rider may be using as a cross-country route.
- Keep as quiet as possible, and stay a reasonable distance from the dressage ring and cross-country obstacles.
- During all phases, competitors require intense concentration.
 Avoid/control loud distractions like children running or sudden movements.
- ✔ A frightened horse may not be under the rider's control! Stay clear.

✓ Caution is advised in the stabling area and around horse trailers where horses are tied; always ask the rider first if you can approach their horse.


