- 3. Equestrian Canada Sport Licence (Bronze Starter to Pre-training, Silver Training, Gold EV105, Preliminary and above) www.equestrian.ca
- 4. Canadian Eventing membership (CE) in conjunction with Sport Licence.

Equestrian Canada is offering an eventing day ticket for those who wish to try a competition at Entry level or below. A day ticket may be purchased at the competition and is only valid for the duration of the event.

A digital horse recording, which is a digital identification document, is required for horses competing at EC silver and above.

No Fee Pony Club & 4-H Promotion

All Pony Club or 4-H members are entitled to participate in one event or clinic without requiring an AHTA membership - EC sport license and provincial memberships are a seperate requirement.

Show results with this membership will not count towards Year End Awards, unless a subsequent full membership is purchased.

Provincially mandated levels

Intent:

Introduce horses and riders to the sport. Courses should be progressive and inviting.

Cross Country:

Speed fault begins at 400 mpm. Speed windows apply as per Entry rules

Single jumping efforts only, with a minimum of 10 strides between fences

No drops or mandatory water

Courses are to be simple and inviting with considerate placement of fences, with flat or gentle terrain approaches & landings

Using different shades or clearly differentiated colours is recommended. Avoid use of reflective materials, gloss paint, or shiny varnishes

Show Jumping:

Maximum Stadium Speed: 300 mpm

No combinations - there must be a minimum of 4 strides between fences

A maximum of 30% of the jumps are permitted to be at maximum height





Starter

Maximum Height: 60 cm Maximum Width at top: 60 cm

X-Country:

Optimum Speed: 300 mpm No obstacles with no height **Show jumping:**

Max Stadium Speed: 300 mpm

No oxers - Verticals or cross rails only

Jumps are to be built with rails only –
no fill/boxes/flowers/planks, etc.



Maximum Height: 75 cm Maximum Width at top: 75 cm

Cross Country:

Optimum Speed: 325 mpm

One set of fences per course, can be closer than 10 strides apart. It must be a minimum of 6 strides apart, numbered separately, and be in an open area & of favourable appearance.

Obstacles without height must have an option

Eventing 101 Clinics

These clinics are geared towards riders that have never been on cross country before

If you have been thinking about getting out to try cross country, this is a great way to get your feet wet! This is a safe, fun, laid back, and low pressure environment under the guidance of experienced clinicians.

All ages and levels of riders are welcome, and no prior experience is necessary, but you must be comfortable jumping small jumps and riding in an open space in a group.

The cost for this special 1 day clinic is \$50, includes one "Intro to Cross Country" lesson, free lunch, and informational talk and Q&A session.

Please note that in 2020, all cross country clinics will require approved body protector vests that meet current Equestrian Canada Eventing rules, Article D114.2. They must meet or exceed, and be appropriately labelled ASTM approved standard F1937-04 (2017), BETA Level 3 body protector standard or European standard EN 13158-2018.

^{*} This clinic is in conjunction with High Performance - it is not a clinic for beginner riders

Rider Representatives

Attends or appoints an alternate to attend all events. The purpose is to provide a vehicle for riders to communicate with event organizers or to find out where to go for various types of assistance. The name of the Rider Representative (or alternate) must be posted on the scoreboard, along with instructions for contact. Riders wishing to make a point with regard to a jump, or the course itself, or any facet of the competition, should do so through the Rider Representative.

The Rider Representative, however, does not handle protests. Competitors wishing to put in a protest must do so as indicated in EC Rules.EC Rules will always supersede any authority of the Competitions Committee or rider Representative. Any complaints regarding an event should be given to the Rider Representative to bring to the attention of the Competitions Committee and the AHTA, who can then open discussions with those concerned.

The Rider Representative should also be able to direct riders to the appropriate people or officials to obtain assistance where needed. In order to protect against liability situations, the Rider Representative must be careful not to dispense advice with regard to coaching techniques or the giving of instruction, but rather is to direct competitors to the right source in order to find the help they may need.





Heads Up Alberta Year-end Awards have changed!

High Point Leaderboard Champions

- 1. Points will be calculated using all Alberta competitions up to preliminary level, and including Out Of Province results for CCI2* and above. Awards will be given annually at the Awards Banquet to the horse/rider combinations who have accumulated the highest number of points in the current season. In the event that no competition at that level is held in the province, then the award will be given to the person maintaining a permanent residence in Alberta who has accumulated the most points.
- 2.Prizes to 3rd place. Ribbons to 8th place. Leaderboard results on website will not be visibly updated after Buster Creek Horse Trials.
- 3. Points are calculated and awarded as per the Table of Points. For NAYC, in addition to all other points possible, an extra 10 points will be awarded to riders who <u>START</u> the competition.
- 4. If a rider eligible for Regular class entry receives points in an Open class (where no Regular one is offered), those points will be awarded in the year end Regular class of the division.

Tie Breakers:

1. Number of firsts. Rider with highest number of first place finishes at division qualified for

2. Number of entries placed above in events where points were earned in division qualified for (cumulative over events in competition years)

3. Higher number of Alberta Events attended in the competition year at division qualified for



Alberta High Performance Eventing Program

Alberta Horse Trials is proud that 2020 marks the thirteenth year of the Eventing High Performance Program.

The Alberta Eventing High Performance (HP) Program is aimed at identifying and developing Alberta riders, horses and coaches. Riders, meeting the membership criteria, are invited to register in the program for the following season. Active Eventing coaches are welcome to audit all HP riding sessions at no charge.

This program does not supply full time coaching. The members are expected to be in a program with their own coaches. The members receive support from the High Performance Coach/Consultant by attending clinics and educational sessions organized through the HP program, as well as completing bi-monthly Training Plans. They are encouraged to bring their coaches to audit the riding sessions so that a Training Program can be developed and discussion can be had regarding what may be lacking in the rider's individual training program as they start training and competing at the upper levels of Eventing.

The High Performance Coach/Consultant for 2020 is Leahona Rowland, from Kelowna, BC. Leahona is a High Performance 1 Certified Coach. The AHTA High Performance Chairperson is Kathleen Ziegler.

Our members have had many educational opportunities, over the past number of years. In addition to lessons with Leahona, previous clinicians have included current and past Canadian Eventing Team members Peter Gray, Lynda Ramsay, Jessica Phoenix, Kyle Carter and Shandiss McDonald. US Eventing Team member Matt Brown. British Event rider James Alliston. Mental Performance Consultant Kara Stelfox B.Kin.(Hon.) M.A., CSEP-CEP; Physio-therapist Sandra Sokoloski BScPT, CGIMS, FCAMPT.

Tips for First-Time Competitors

Welcome! The sport is an exciting discipline and offers a fun, fantastic, & supportive community. The eventing levels in Alberta start with the 'Starter' and then the 'Pre-Entry' division. The dressage tests in these divisions require walk, trot and canter in a series of relatively simple patterns. The cross country courses can be ridden at a slow steady canter, giving you plenty of time to drop down to the trot for fence approaches if you want. The stadium jumping will also be straight forward and encouraging with no combinations. See the descriptions for the levels on page 11 and 12 of this handbook!

- Attend an AHTA Eventing 101 Clinic (see pg. 22)
- Enter early events can fill up
- Make sure you have the appropriate memberships
 - Know the rules a rule book can be downloaded from Equestrian Canada
 - Be in condition; this is not just a test for the horse! Plus, time spent conditioning your horse is time well spent in developing trust and confidence between the two of you
 - Walk the cross country course several times
 - Ask questions! Eventers are very friendly & love to help each other
 - Don't forget the mandatory tack checks
 - Always keep the RED flag on your RIGHT hand side this goes for warm ups and on course
 - In the dressage test, wait for the judge's signal before entering the ring.
- In dressage, use a white saddle pad if possible. It is customary to braid your horse's mane.
- Don't forget to correctly salute the judge at end of your dressage test
- In the stadium jumping test, salute the judge. Once you hear the signal you have 45 seconds to cross the start line.
- A thank you to the organizer & volunteers goes a long way!
- Bring a friend to help out & share the day's fun with you
- Most importantly;

Spectators

A few tips to keep us all safe!

Spectators are very welcome at all phases of horse trials

Competitors enjoy performing for an audience and being appreciated for their efforts. Feel free to ask questions at the show office, or of anyone who is not busy with a horse, or judging and scoring. Please remember that the competitors are probably quite focused on what they are doing.

For your own and the competitors safety, please remain alert to the following precautions:

- Horses are large, unpredictable animals and are easily frightened by sudden movements, sounds and unfamiliar sights
- Horses can be difficult to control please give horses and riders ample room to maneuver
- Avoid startling horses by running or shouting, and advise your children to keep back
- In the stabling area, caution is advised. Respect all signs and always ask before interacting with horses

During the **dressage phase**, a lot of concentration is required on the part of the horses, the riders, and the judges. Please remember to keep as quiet as possible, and stay at a reasonable distance from the dressage rings. No allowance is given if a horse is frightened by something, which would cause the competitor to lose marks.

Cross country day can be tense for everyone. Competitors are focused intently on the job at hand, and may not be aware of a spectator



crossing their path. You are welcome to watch and walk anywhere on the course, it is vital that you are at no time on the path a horse and rider may be using. Some jumps offer optional routes, so be aware. Hold onto small children and be quiet and still near cross country obstacles. The riders will be penalized for run outs or refusals no matter the reason!

In **stadium jumping**, spectators often line the arena fences to gain the best view of this last and often nerve wracking phase. Usually the order of go is the reverse order of placing. Noises and distractions should be kept to a minimum, as the competitors require intense concentration.

Keep in mind:


- Horses have the right away at all times
- "Heads up" means clear the way quickly!
- Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times
- Keep your children well back and under control
- Give horses ample room to maneuver
- Routes and obstacles might differ for each rider!
- Keep as quiet as possible, and maintain a reasonable distance from the dressage ring and cross country obstacles
- Competitors will be eliminated if any assistance is given to them, even if they don't ask for it. Don't talk to them, point the way, or coach from the sidelines.
- Always ask if you can approach a horse
- A frightened or excited horse may not be under the riders control. Stay clear!
- Cheering is encouraged! Have fun!




Dressage Tests









Dressage tests have no time limit; the approximate times allowed are stated to provide guidance for scheduling

All trot work is to be executed sitting, unless otherwise directed The four general impression marks on all EC and FEI dressage tests have a co-efficient of two each:

- 1. Paces (freedom and regularity) 10 x 2
- Impulsion (the desire to move forward, elasticity of the steps and engagement of the hindquarters)10 x 2
- 3. Submission (attention and obedience, lightness and ease of the movement, acceptance of the bridle 10 x 2
- 4. Position and seat of the rider, correct use of the aids 10 x 2
