## Alberta Horse Trials Association EV105/Modified and Above Leaderboard Awards Policy





AHTA's annual leaderboard results for divisions not consistently offered in Alberta (above the EV105/Modified level) are determined through member submission of their results. Awards will be given at the Awards Banquet to the horse/rider combinations who have accumulated the highest number of points in the current season. Funding for these awards comes from the general AHTA budget, which includes yearly membership dues and incomes from member fundraising (casinos, etc.).

Points are calculated and awarded as per the <u>Table of Points</u>. For youth championship events, in addition to all other points possible, an extra 10 points will be awarded to riders who <u>START</u> the competition. There is no differentiation between 'open' and 'regular' sections for these divisions.

Tie Breakers:

1. Rider with the highest number of first place finishes in the competition season at the division qualified.

2. Number of entries placed above in events where points were earned in division qualified (cumulative over events in competition years)

3. Higher number of Alberta Events attended in the competition year at division qualified for

For new divisions, there must be 3 events offered in a season at the new level before AHTA will not add out of province results to the leaderboard results (i.e., there must be 3 intermediate events offered in Alberta before the Statistics chair would no longer count out of province results at intermediate in the Year End Leaderboard).

## Eligibility:

Applicants must:

- 1. Be in good standing with AHTA and all Alberta event organisers, AEF, and EC (dues paid in full).
- 2. Have no disciplinary actions for the current membership year at provincial, federal and international level.
- 3. Comply with the Equestrian Canada Code of Conduct & Ethics.

## Submitting an EV105/Modified and Above Leaderboard Application

Complete an Out of Province Results and Competition Subsidy form, submitting results from October 1 of the previous competition year, up to September 30th of the current competition year (eg: a 2021 Subsidy application would include any eligible events completed from October 1, 2020- September 30, 2021).

Attach a printout of the results from the scoring website- must show:

- Event name
- Date
- Division
- Number of starters
- Results from each phase (dressage score, time and jump faults)
- final placing

Deadline for a complete application is **October 1st.** Application must be complete to be considered. Leaderboard awards will vary from year to year based on funding availability.
