VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Good afternoon everyone and thank you for joining us today. As we look back on this year, we also begin our planning for 2023. Today we will be electing new board members to the AHTA Board of Directors, as well as reflecting on the past year with our various director reports. At our Organizer's Forum tomorrow, the organizers and board members will discuss how things went this year as well as improvements to be made for 2023.

We are sad to announce that Crissy Embury has resigned from her position as president, as well as the board. We want to thank her for all her hard work and dedication. I as vice president will be stepping in to cover the presidential duties until our November 19th meeting, where we will appoint board positions and a new president.

The board has accomplished a lot of great things this year, Safety continues to be our #1 priority and we purchased 2 AED's that were on site at all AHTA & HP's clinics this year and will continue to be in the future as well. Event organizers embraced our new medical policy, which gives grants for providing higher level medical services at events. We also offered each of the event sites an special grant of \$5000 to help support the development of the EV105 level to help bridge the gap between training and prelim. All of this was in addition to the regular event site support we provide, and we are incredibly proud to have been able to support our Organizing Committees with \$70,000 of funding in 2022.

We continued to offer clinics and educational opportunities for all levels, from the grassroots to our high performance levels. We work hard to keep our clinics affordable for all members.

I am going into my 9th year on the board, and I can honestly say it has been an amazing and rewarding experience and I have learned so much along the way, and have had a lot of fun too! I am so passionate about this sport and I want to continue to be involved to keep improving it, sharing it with others, and help ensure that it will be around for many more years and that many more people will enjoy it. I want to thank every one of the board members I have worked with over the years, you each have contributed a lot of time and dedication, and brought all different skills to the table. I appreciate all you have done for the association and for your support. COMMUNICATIONS REPORT

After covid, I was happy to have 2022 be back on track with regular communication and updates for our members. I continue to manage and update both the AHTA & High Performance websites, as well social media for both AHTA & HP Facebook and Instagram pages. I also put out the monthly AHTA email newsletter, so between the website, social media, and email newsletter, all of our members are able to easily stay up to date without relying solely on social media.

All numbers are up from 2021:

AHTA Facebook - 2136 followers

AHTA Instagram - 1118 followers

HP Facebook - 391 followers

HP IInstagram - 489 followers

Email Newsletter - 924 subscribers - the majority of new subscribers come from the sign up pop up on our website.

Website - slightly more than half of users on mobile, rest on computer, and our Competition & Clinic pages still remain the most popular. In 2023 I am planning on adding more information and resources to the Eventing 101 section and for those that are "New To Eventing".

Our Youtube has just 34 subscribers - which is not surprising since we mostly upload webinars and informational content, not entertainment. Our "How To" videos that we created a few years back are our most popular videos, with over 1500 views on the Seiko Cross Country Timer video, and 1700 on the Polartek Show Jumping Timer video.

I continue to assist Kathleen and help a lot behind the scenes with the High Performance team. I helped Kathleen with the 3 Online Educational Zoom sessions we had during the winter earlier this year, I moderated the sessions and uploaded them to Youtube afterwards.

All the sessions were well received and attendance was fairly good, the April Clay sessions were quite popular and we had attendees from nearly every province as well as some from the US which was very exciting.

Webinars on Youtube have between 50 & 100 views, most likely coming from those registered who weren't able to attend, the Youtube link was emailed out afterwards to all registered & also posted on social media.

I also worked with Brenda Thompson this summer to redo the Young Prospect Program score sheets - instead of paper they are now an online google sheet that automatically calculates scoring and you can print off as well to have both online and hard copies.

For AHTA this year I created new online forms instead of fillable pdfs for Clinic Registration, for some of the year end awards, for several event site funding application & reimbursement forms, and the coaching & official funding application. For 2023 I plan to create online forms for Out Of Province results, and the breed awards.

Event Evaluation forms that we introduced last year were well received, we had 21 responses last year, this year we had over 30 responses, everyone gave lots of good feedback that has been passed on to both the board and the organizers so we know what we can do to improve for next year..

During covid I started a list of free online webinar and seminars, which was popular, and now I've created a page on the website for them which is updated with AHTA seminars as well as other interesting equestrian webinars. It's mostly updated in the winter/off season as that's when the majority of these take place.

It's been a while since we have put our surveys on different topics to our members to get feedback and opinions on different things, so I foresee us utilizing some of those again going forward.

As always, I am here to give our members a voice and anyone is welcome to contact me anytime with any questions, ideas or suggestions. We want to hear it!

It was another busy year for the High Performance Program. 2022 is the 15th year that this program has been in place. We had a total of 31 members (U18 had 9 members and the High Performance had 22). Leahona Rowland, from Kelowna, BC is the Coach/Consultant.

For people who may not be familiar with the program - it does not take the place of a coach for a rider being in a competitive program. The High Performance Program is to be used to supplement a rider's education. Riders are expected to be in a consistent training program with their own coach(es). Leahona is only in Alberta for HP clinics 3 or 4 times. Other than that, she has the riders complete quarterly Training Plans and she makes herself available to the riders when they have questions/concerns/need someone to talk to about their horse. For the U18 riders - they also attend the High Performance clinics but they do not have to complete any paperwork. If young riders are wishing to compete at the Young Rider Eventing Championships - it is highly recommended they join the program, once they meet the registration requirements as there is a great deal of protocol that has to be followed/minimum eligibility requirements that have to be met to compete at Championships.

Our winter zoom sessions were offered to anyone interested, at no charge:

January - April Clay "Developing Confident Riders" - 102 registered

February-April Clay "Performing Under Pressure" - 143 registered

March-Dr. Sarah Pedersen "Care of the Aging Event Horse" - 69 registered

Thank you to Jessica Kerschbaumer for getting the presentations set up on Zoom, being an excellent moderator and for placing the presentations on YouTube.

Additional unmounted sessions included:

April- in an attempt to help prospective Coaches get their required First Aid Training, we worked with Wheels On Safety Training and offered a Red Cross Standard First Aid CPR/AED Training Course at a reduced rate. There were 8 who signed up for the course.

-Dylan Barry XC CD Clinic - this clinic was organized to help riders/coaches/prospective competition officials learn about the different XC jumps; proper placement on course; get an insight to what a CD may be thinking as they are designing a course; learn how to plan and build a XC jump. And finally, Safety - what are the characteristics of a safe XC jump and how can it be painted/decorated to increase safety. MIMS/Frangible Pins and how they work when they are activated. 23 people had registered to attend.

The HP mounted sessions started in March and one was held monthly to June, with Leahona Rowland.

July saw the return of former US Eventing Team member Matt Brown and the 2 full clinics ran over 4 days (2 days for HP and 2 days for regular AHTA members). There was a total of 42 riders and the clinic registration fee was held at \$300. AHTA helped offset expenses by paying the facility rental fees for the 4 days and the High Performance Silent Auction funds from 2021 were also added to the clinic, to keep costs down for all of the riders. If this support had not been available for the clinic the registration fee would have been \$425.

The Kyle Carter Young Rider Clinic ran in August. This was a mandatory clinic for the riders wanting to compete at the YR Championships and the remaining clinic spots were made available to others. Kyle was kept busy as 25 riders registered for this clinic.

Unfortunately, the one clinic that we had to cancel was the Peter Gray Dressage Clinic that was going to be held in June. At one time, we had a total of 18 riders registered. Then, between lameness and rider illness/CoVid, we had dwindled down to 6 riders. This led to the decision to cancel.

At the present time, we are in the process of accompanying a team of 6 to the USEF Young Rider Eventing Championships in Tryon, North Carolina. The 1*team is Mackenzie Hoffman, McKenzie Saker, Anna Nelson and Madeleine Shank. Our 2* rider is Caitlyn Sutherland and the only Canadian 3* rider is Mikayla Hoffman. Ontario (3 riders) and Quebec (2 riders) are the only other provinces who have riders attending Championships. Alberta has the largest contingent of Canadian Young Riders heading to Championships so everyone should be very proud of that.

The young riders are fortunate to be able to spend a week in Florida, at Training Camp with Team Coach Kyle Carter. They will then travel to Tryon for the competition. The riders have worked very hard in fundraising as this is an expensive endeavor. They are extremely grateful to AHTA for covering the Coaching fees for Kyle. They are also very appreciative for all of the support from the Eventing community whether that was buying 50/50 tickets or bidding on Silent Auction items; Alhambra Stables for hiring the riders to help at the competitions; donations of products for the Silent Auction or donation of products for the riders to use at Championships such as coolers, bonnets, dressage boots, stall guards...And, last but certainly not least, the generous cash donations. The Alberta riders will be putting their best foot forward to make everyone proud.

Future plans for High Performance/U18 Programs - we will continue, as long as AHTA permits it. Leahona Rowland will return for another year, as the Coach/Consultant. We may have to get creative with some alternative programming as costs continue to go up everywhere. We try to keep the High Performance clinics as affordable as possible because education is very important in this sport. We need to continue to provide learning opportunities to develop safe, competent riders and coaches.




EVENT STATISTICS-Total Rides Per Year






EVENT STATISTICS-Rides by Division

A shared clinic between Peter GREY / Samantha BALOGH intended to be hosted by Minds Eye Ranch was also cancelled due to a tremendous amount of participants withdrawing in the two weeks prior.

The Annual Ride and Dine Clinic hosted by Alhambra Stables had 19 participants instructed by Jenn SMART.

The newly purchased AED was on site for all clinics.

I used the deferred AHTA silent auction funds to help cover some of the loss.

The additional expense for "Subsidy" was the agreed AHTA portion towards Matt Brown. While this was a HP/AHTA clinic- it was done under HP.
