# PROVINCIALLY

### Mandated Levels

### INTENT

Introduce horses and riders to the sport.

Courses should be progressive and inviting.

### **CROSS COUNTRY**

- Speed fault begins at 400 mpm. Speed windows apply as per EV85 rules.
- Single jumping efforts only
  - Minimum 10 strides between fences
- No drops
- No mandatory water
- Courses should be simple & inviting, with considerate placement of fences on flat or gentle terrain
- Use of clearly differentiated colors is recommended, avoiding reflective materials, gloss paint, or shiny varnishes.

### **SHOW JUMPING**

- Maximum Speed: 300 mpm
- No combinations a minimum of 4 strides between fences
- A maximum of 30% jumps are permitted at maximum height















### **EV60 LEVEL**

Maximum height: 60 cm Maximum width at top: 60 cm

### **Cross Country:**

- Optimum Speed: 300 mpm
- No obstacles without height

### **Show Jumping:**

- Maximum speed: 300 mpm
- No oxers
- Rails only no fill, planks, boxes...

### **EV75 LEVEL**

Maximum height: 75 cm Maximum width at top: 75 cm

### **Cross Country:**

- Optimum Speed: 325 mpm
- Obstacles without height must have an option
- There may be one combination. Fences must be a minimum of 6 strides apart and numbered separately. They must be of favorable appearance and in an inviting open area.

### **EV 105**

### WHAT IS EV 105?

A new level introduced to bridge the gap between EV100 (previously training level) and EV110 (previously preliminary level). It is set to the height of 1.05m and has an increase in technicality in all three phases from EV100

height: 1.05m, brush; 1.25m; spreads: 1.6m





The EV105 level is a great stepping stone between the EV100 and the EV110 level. It has similar technical elements to EV110, but with a more inviting height of 105cm. Often distances are set to have more strides but the same questions on the EV110 course, allowing for riders and horses to build confidence. Thinking of running an FEI or EV110? Try a EV105 first!

The AHTA has been collecting safety information from Alberta event technical delegate reports and Startbox since 2019. We are starting to be able to report on some general safety trends at our events, such as rider falls, horse falls, and eliminations in all phases.

### Trends: Rider fall rates are improving!

In 2019, we were seeing 1 in every 23 riders falling In 2022, we saw a fall rate of 1 in every 88 riders



# RIDER REPRESENTATIVES

A selected AHTA Director acts as the Rider Representative at each event. The purpose is to provide a vehicle for riders to communicate with event organizers or to find out where to go for various types of assistance. The name of the Rider Representative will be posted on the scoreboard, along with instructions for contact. Riders wishing to make a point with regard to any facet of the competition should do so through the Rider Representative. Any complaints regarding an event should be given to the Rider Representative to bring to the attention of the Competitions Committee and the AHTA, who can then open discussions with those concerned.



In order to protect against liability situations, the Rider Representative must be careful not to dispense advice with regard to coaching techniques or the giving of instruction, but rather is to direct competitors to the right source in order to find the help they may need.


### High Point

### LEADERBOARD

- 1. Points will be calculated using all Alberta competitions up to preliminary level, and including Out Of Province results for EV105 and above. Awards will be given annually at the Awards Banquet to the horse/rider combinations who have accumulated the highest number of points in the current season. In the event that no competition at that level is held in the province, then the award will be given to the AHTA member who has accumulated the most points.
- 2. Prizes to 2nd place. Ribbons to 6th place.
- 3. Points are calculated and awarded as per the Table of Points. For NAYC, in addition to all other points possible, an extra 10 points will be awarded to riders who START the competition.
- 4. If a rider eligible for Regular class entry receives points in an Open class (where no Regular one is offered), those points will be awarded in the year end Regular class of the division.

### Tie Breakers:

- 1. Number of firsts. Rider with highest number of first place finishes at division qualified for
- 2. Number of entries placed above in events where points were earned in division qualified for (cumulative over events in competition years)
- 3. Higher number of Alberta Events attended in the competition year at division qualified for



# ALBERTA HIGH PERFORMANCE EVENTING PROGRAM

Alberta Horse Trials is proud that 2023 marks the sixteenth year of the Eventing High Performance Program.

The Alberta Eventing High Performance (HP) Program is aimed at developing Alberta riders and horses that are competing at the Training level and above, who are interested in pursuing the sport at the upper levels. The program is separated into three tiers - the High Performance Team (riders who have completed 3 Prelim level horse trials) and the Development Team (riders who have 3 Training MER and are getting ready to move to the Prelim level) and U18 (riders who are aged 12-18 years and have at least 2 PreTraining MER). Riders, meeting the membership criteria, are invited to register in the program for the following season. Active Eventing coaches are welcome to audit all HP riding sessions at no charge.

This program does not replace full time coaching, but is in place to supplement and help guide a full program. HP members are required to be in a training program with their own coach(es). The team members are encouraged to bring their coach(es) to audit the riding sessions so that performance planning and skills assessment can be discussed including all parties involved in a rider's program.

Leahona Rowland, from Kelowna, BC, is entering her seventh year as the HP Coach/Consultant. Leahona is a High Performance 1 Certified Coach. The AHTA High Performance Chairperson is Kathleen Ziegler.

Our members have had many educational opportunities over the past number of years. In addition to lessons with Leahona, previous clinicians have included current and past Canadian Eventing Team members Peter Gray, Lynda Ramsay, Jessica Phoenix, Kyle Carter and Shandiss McDonald; US Eventing Team member Matt Brown; FEI Veterinarians Dr. Karen Nyrop and Dr. Alyssa Butters; as well as veterinarian Dr. Sarah Pedersen, registered Psychologist April Clay and equine nutritionist Tanja Minder BSc Ag EEBW.



### **SPECTATORS**

During the dressage phase, a lot of concentration is required on the part of the horses, the riders, and the judges. Please remember to keep as quiet as possible, and stay at a reasonable distance from the dressage rings. No allowance is given if a horse is frightened by something, which would cause the competitor to lose marks.

Cross country day can be tense for everyone. Competitors are focused intently on the job at hand, and may not be aware of a spectator crossing their path. While you are welcome to watch and walk anywhere on the course, it is vital that you are at no time on the path a horse and rider may be using. Be aware that some jumps offer optional routes. Hold onto small children and dogs, and be quiet & still near cross country obstacles. The riders will be penalized for run outs or refusals no matter the reason!

In stadium jumping, spectators often line the arena fences to gain the best view of this last and often nerve wracking phase. Usually the order of go is the reverse order of placing. Noises and distractions should be kept to a minimum, as the competitors require extreme concentration.

### Please keep in mind:

- Horses have the right away at all times
- "Heads Up" means clear the way quickly!
- Keep your children & dogs well back and under control
- Maintain a reasonable distance from the dressage ring and cross country obstacles
- Competitors will be eliminated if any assistance is given to them. Don't talk to them, point the way, or coach from the sidelines
- An excited or frightened horse may not be under the riders control- stay clear!

### A FEW TIPS TO KEEP US **ALL SAFE!**

- Horses are large, unpredictable animals and are easily frightened by sudden movements, sounds and unfamiliar sights
- Horses can be difficult to control - please give horses and riders ample room to maneuver
- Avoid startling horses by running or shouting, and advise your children to keep back
- In the stabling area, caution is advised. Respect all signs and always ask before interacting with horses

# FIRST TIME COMPETITORS


This sport is an exciting discipline and offers a fun & supportive community.

The eventing levels in Alberta start with the EV60 and EV75 divisions. The dressage tests in these divisions require walk, trot and canter in a series of relatively simple patterns. The cross country courses can be ridden at a slow steady canter, giving you plenty of time to drop down to the trot for fence approaches if you want. The stadium jumping will also be straight forward and encouraging.

We've outlined some of the expectations in this handbook - flip back a couple pages to take a look!

### Here are some other good suggestions to get you started in eventing:

- Work with a certified instructor that has experience with cross country
- Enter events early- they can fill up quickly. Payment secures your spot.
- Make sure you have all the appropriate memberships
- Know the rules find the rule book on Equestrian Canada at https://www.equestrian.ca/programs-services/rules
- Be in condition; this is not just a test for the horse!
- Walk the cross country course several times
- Ask questions! Eventers are very friendly & love to help
- Don't forget the mandatory tack check for dressage
- Always keep the RED flag on your RIGHT hand side this goes for warm ups & on course
- In the dressage test, wait for the judge's signal before entering the ring. Use a white saddle pad & braid your horse's mane.
- Don't forget to correctly salute the judge at end of your dressage test
- A thank you to the organizer & volunteers goes a long way!



# STARTING CAN BE DAUNTING

### Which division do I choose?

**Open Division:** Intended for experienced horse-rider combinations who have demonstrated results at a higher level

**Regular Division:** Intended for horse-rider combinations just starting out in competition, or upgrading to a new level

### **Scoring**

- The object is to get the very lowest possible score, since the scores are calculated as 'Penalty Points'
- Your dressage score is calculated at "however much less than perfect" out of the highest score possible
- From there, your aim is to add no more penalties to your dressage score with your jumping phases
- You can add penalty points to your score in cross country with refusals, or if you exceed the optimum time or finish under the speed fault time
- You can add penalty points to your score in stadium with refusals, knocking rails down, or exceeding time


### **Stadium Jumping**

Knocking down an obstacle - 4 points
1st disobedience on course - 4 points
2nd disobedience on course - Elimination for
EV120, EV115, EV110 divisions
2nd disobedience on course - 8 penalties for
divisions up to and including EV105
3rd disobedience on course - Elimination for
divisions up to and including EV105
Over time - 0.25 points per second

### **Cross Country**

1st disobedience - 20 points
2nd disobedience at same obstacle - 40
points
3rd disobedience at same obstacle Elimination
4th disobedience on course - Elimination
Over optimum time - 0.4 points per second
Under speed fault time - 1 point per second
Activating a frangible device - 11 points

### Here are some diagrammed examples of cross country refusals & permissible lines:



- Pay attention as to whether the obstacles are numbered separately or as a combination
- A refusal is whenever your horse stops at an obstacle so that you have to represent, or takes a step backwards at the obstacle
- A run out occurs if the horse has been presented to an obstacle, but avoids the element in such a way that it must be presented again.
- On XC you are not required to re-jump all the elements of a combination, if you have a refusal or run out at any one of them. You may re-jump all the elements if you wish, or just re-present at the element you had the refusal or runout.

Please note that this is only a summary - the EC Rule Book will be your best resource!



# COMPETITORS, PLEASE REMEMBER....

Please read through your whole show package at each competition!

In an effort to not crowd the warm up rings, please be mindful of not heading over too early.

Tack check is only mandatory for dressage, and although recommended, is provided as a courtesy for the other two phases.

If you are eliminated or retire on cross country, you still have to report to the finish line personnel. Please get off the course as quickly as possible, then head to finish - you do not have to bring your horse.



The four General Impression marks included on all EC Eventing - Entry test – A & B Pre-Training test A & B, Training test A & B and the Preliminary HT test are as follows:
